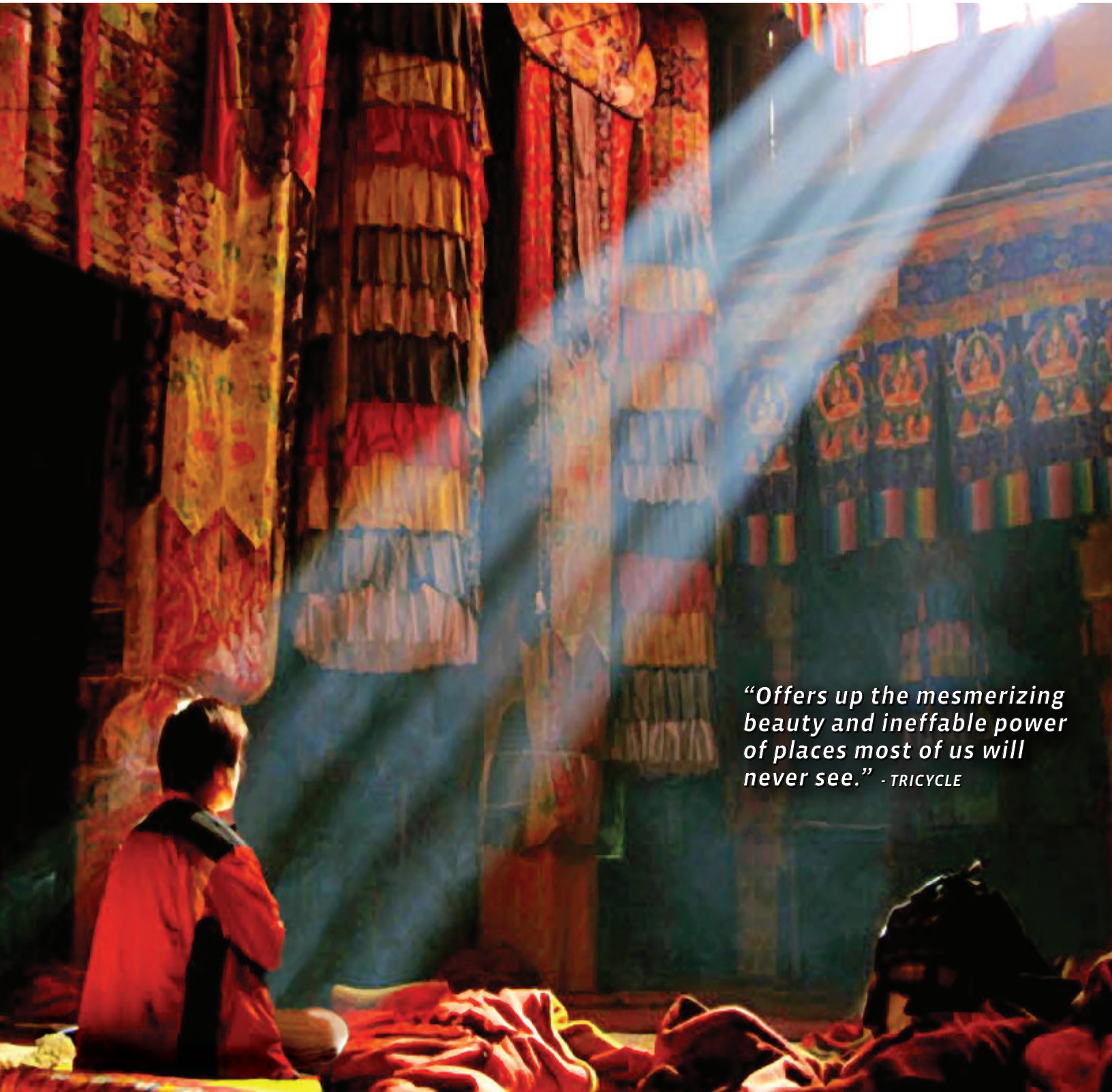

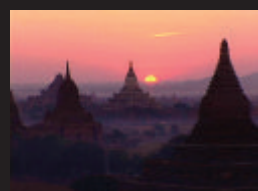

# PRAJNA EARTH

Filmed entirely on location in SE Asia by director John Bush, this second film of this trilogy is a stunning cinematic journey to the legendary temples of Angkor in Cambodia, the spiritual sites of Bali and finally the marvel of Buddhist Borobudur in Java. PRAJNA EARTH is a pilgrimage to sacred intersections where Buddhism meets its sources - the Hindu wisdom traditions and the animist worship of nature.

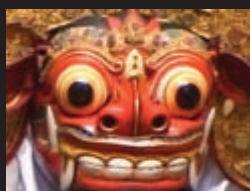
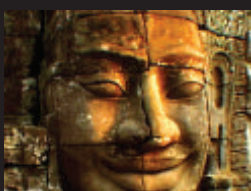
Monks & nuns travel on foot for days to reach a full moon gathering near Angkor Wat - the largest temple in the world. Discover the mystery of Angkor's vanished civilization and explore magnificent temples returning to the overgrown jungle. The dance of the Devatas celebrates the rebirth of this classic art form within the cultural healing of war-torn Cambodia.

As the journey moves to Bali - gamelan music, Ramayana dance and lively street processions are featured in the hill town of Ubud. High in the misty mountains within a volcanic crater lies a timeless lake holding a Devi temple. Colorful festivals, gilded temples, cave shrines, rice terraces, lotus ponds and holy springs are all part of this visit to a sacred world.

In Java, a night of animist trance dance and spirit possession is followed by a golden dawn and ascent up the startling seven level stupa of Borobudur. Made from over a million blocks of volcanic rock, this man-made mountain is covered with extraordinary bas reliefs of Buddhist teachings. Built in the 9th century as a vast device for enlightenment, Borobudur is one of the world's great wonders.

# VAJRA SKY OVER TIBET

*Vajra (vahj-rah, as in Taj) is a sanskrit word - the thunderbolt of awakening that cuts through delusion. It is the indestructible power of truth at the heart of Vajrayana Buddhism in Tibet.*

Filmed entirely on location in Central Tibet, VAJRA SKY is a cinematic pilgrimage offering a direct experience of some of the most revered temples, monasteries, and festivals still surviving. This colorful journey unfolds within the magnificent Himalayan terrain. A feature length documentary, VAJRA SKY bears witness to the profound devotion, spiritual power and enduring faith within today's endangered Tibetan Buddhist community and the imminent threat to its very survival.

The vastness of the Tibetan sky reflecting snow mountains, rushing rivers, and turquoise lakes, leads the journey westward to the holy sites of Shigatse and Gyantse. One discovers an abundance of revered paintings and sculpture within its original context. Returning to Lhasa, pilgrims circumambulate in front of the legendary Jokhang Temple. Luminous faces of faith glow in the flicker of butter lamp offerings within its many shrines including that of the most revered image in Tibet – The Jowo Buddha.

The empty windows and doors of the traditional homes of His Holiness The Dalai Lama, the Potala and Norbulinka, signal his painful absence. Yet the exuberant blossoms of the Summer Palace hold the promise of natural cycles of return. During the colorful Drepung Monastery festival, a giant scroll painting of the Buddha covers a mountain as spiritually famished Chinese join with the multitude of Tibetan pilgrims.
